





From here we went to the Carriage Shop, Leather Shop, Wood Carving Shop, Grist Mill, and the Glass blower's shop. By now, it was nearing 4 p.m. when we were to meet at the front gate with the group. As we were walking that way, some of our group were eating ice cream and so we made a stop too. Yum!! Visiting with our group, they had 10 interest areas to pick from to look out. It would really take 2 days to see and do rides and etc. to cover the area. What I mentioned is what interested Keith and I and what we could cover in the time we had. Back on the bus, all tired from walking and the heat we had that day. We enjoyed the riding back to Pigeon Forge to attend the Dixie Stampede. Another beautiful production with costumes, 32 horses, several wagons, cast of top-notched riders, and at the end, their outfits and horses's harnesses were lite up. Just breath taking!!! The show went on while we were eating our supper with ONLY your fingers!!! When you are done, they do bring warm hot towels to wash you hands. (While waiting for the show to begin at the Dixie Stampede Saloon, Bob & Bev met a couple they had known while living in Florida. They haven't seen them for years and the couple was on vacation in Tennessee. Both couples were so surprised and one never knows who you might meet on vacation.)

Thursday was our Smoky Mountain tour picking up a guide to ride the bus with us, Sonny Smith, banjo player from the band at Hatfield & McCoy Show. He explained that the Mountains look like they have a blue haze over them like a light smoke because the trees put off a pollen that creates the look. More information he shared of the mountains was they are part of the oldest mountain range in the United States, 2000 miles long from Georgia up through Maine, and has the largest rain forest in the United States. Our bus driver, Jim, drove the bus up a very curvey road to Newfound Gap with an elevation of 5,000 feet. Words just can't describe what one saw of the beauty there. Sonny also told us that salamanders make up the largest official population in the Smoky mountains of wild creatures living there. Black bear, red fox and moon shiners live in the forests, too. Ha! We then drove down to Gatlinburg where we had lunch wherever we wanted to eat and check out the shops there. After a couple of hours, back on the bus and went to the Titanic Museum at Pigeon Forge. When entering, everyone received a boarding pass and had a name on it who you were for the tour. At the end of the tour, you were able to check the list of names to see if you survived the wreck or didn't. Keith and I both survived and our people lived until they were 77 years old. We got to feel what a real ice berg would feel like plus the very cold water (28 degrees cold) that the people fell in. Very, very cold! It was a lot of reading but sort of sobering at the same time thinking how many died and what must have gone through their minds at that moment. One of our people on the bus tour had a great-aunt or aunt on the ship who died by the name of Funk. I'm sure they had some mixed feelings reading her name on the list of people who didn't survive. I know I would if it was a relative of mine.

Our evening was open for supper and so we went to Golden Corral which we all enjoyed a lot with the assortment of food. For some reason strange reason, people took steak, fish, pizza, salads, fruit, and desserts and NO CHICKEN! I'm sure every bite was enjoyed with the variety since all the theater meals consisted of CHICKEN (broasted, baked, fried, or strips), potatoes, cole slaw, half a cob of corn, biscuits, pudding or cookie for dessert. Ha!

Last show for our trip was at the Comedy Barn Theater! It was an evening of laughing, high energy, fast pace family fun. Acts consisted of dogs doing tricks, cloggers, magic show, juggler, singing, and much more. The MC said he went to school with Minnie Pearl and she told him he would be successful if he would do the following: "Don't do or say anything you won't want your grandmother to hear or see." He said it has worked with their success with the Comedy Barn Show and hopes it continues. When you leave, your body sort of hurts a little from all the laughing you did and I'm sure everyone slept rather well that evening.

Friday morning our suitcases were picked up and loaded on the bus by 8:30 a.m. After breakfast, we headed to the East Tennessee Hills to Chestnut Hill, home of BUSH Baked Beans. Today, the company's signature baked beans are the <u>number one</u> selling brand in the United States. We spent about an hour or more looking over their museum and shopping in the store plus watched a 6 minute movie of the operation of the plant. 




