owners anticipate broadening services to the south.

The Kisseberths make an excellent team: Doug came to the business with 14 years of professional driving and 4 years of driving instruction experience. He is the primary driving instructor. Doug also holds a degree in business/accounting from Bluffton University. Sara runs the Drive Time office and is a classroom instructor; she is also the web communications manager at Bluffton University.

Drive Time also employs Casey Lauger, Karen Fink, Duane Weaver, and Chuck Chiow, as classroom and in-car instructors.

Together, the Drive Time staff make drivers' education comfortable and fun. Sara notes that their number one attraction is convenience, followed by "our goal of driving qualified students quickly. Ideally, we would like to make sure that all students complete their driver's education requirements right before they are eligible to get their license." And the Drive Time instructors aren't far off that mark. Ninety percent of students pass their driving test the first time.

One thing the Kisseberths were not able to influence was winter weather, which kept some students off the road. Sara explains that additional instructors and the purchase of a third car has put more students behind the wheel.

The Kisseberths are pleased with their Bluffton location and students. Sara remarks, "I would not be surprised to see our business in Bluffton match or surpass our Findlay classes.... Bluffton is a very supportive community with good people and quality youth."
