THIS CHARTER shall be in full force and effect from the day of the date hereof, and for such time as the Members of the Local Club shall conform to the laws and rules of the International Association: Otherwise this Charter shall be revoked.

Past International Director Murray has been recognized for 48 years of perfect attendance and is a life member of the St. Marys Lions Club in St. Marys, Ontario, Canada. He has served in most club offices, including club president, zone chairman, deputy district governor, district governor, vice chairman of his Multiple District Council of Governors and promotional chairman for his multiple district.

In the district of A-9 he served as District Governor 1974-75 and continued onto the Vice Chair Governors Council. He then became an International Director in 1981-83.

He has received seven Extension Awards, the 100% District Governor Award, 14 district Governor's Appreciation Awards, five International President's Awards and is a Key Member. He is also a recipient of the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association gives to its members.

PID Murray founded Canada's first International Youth Camp and served for six years as its director. He also founded the Lions Foundation of Canada. And he is currently the Chairman of the Board of Lions Quest for Canada.

Past Director Murray is married to Lion Janis, has 5 children, 8 grandchildren, and 2 great-grandchildren and is enjoying retirement with his family.

HISTORY AND CONTRIBUTIONS OF THE BLUFFTON LIONS CLUB

The Bluffton Lions Club was chartered February 19, 1934 with 19 members. It was organized as a community service club to create and foster a spirit of cooperation and fellowship for the promotion of programs for the common good.

The following are excerpts taken from our files, not necessarily in time sequence, reflecting this history:

Lions erected the first welcome sign on South Main on May 7, 1935. Lions sponsored Bluffton's first airmail pick-up commemorating the 20th anniversary of U.S. Air Mail Service, landing the plane on the Noah Moser farm north of town May 19, 1938.

Sponsored new Lions clubs in Findlay, Rawson, Beaverdam, Columbus Grove and New Hampshire.

Participated in the International Student Exchange. Sponsored the peace oratorical contest. Sold tickets for athletic events and gave contributions for midget athletic league.

Organized and sponsored the annual basketball holiday tournament. Furnished labor and money to restore the pool and clean up of the Buckeye swimming pool and picnic area.

Sponsored a chest x-ray program. Erected and maintained street markers in town. Actively participated in War Bond drives. In charge of March of Dimes initial drives. Helped in Red Cross solicitation. Collected clothing for international relief after World War II. Sponsored and supported levies for sewer construction. Conducted automobile safety checks with state and local patrols. Supported the local mosquito control program. Provided floats for July parades, Halloween parades and Blaze of Lights parades. Provided hearing examinations. Christmas blankets sent to blind or needy. Sponsors Citizen-of-the-Year awards since 1981. Published the first community calendar in 1950. Provides litter cleanup of Hancock County Road 313.

Provides scholarships to high school and college students. 1983 started to co-sponsor annual Pancake Day with Senior Citizens. 1959 sponsored Rubinoff and his Violin in Concert at the high school. 2002 established an annual community health fair with the Bluffton Hospital. Contributed to purchase school band uniforms. Contributed furnishings to the Allen County Children's Home. Assisted in securing a new \$80,000 post office building. Assisted with furnishing for the Bluffton Hospital, paid for room redecorating and contributed with new addition projects. Contributions to: Ohio Eye Research, Ohio Pilot Dog Programs, Northwest Ohio Eye Bank, Lions Clubs International Foundation, VOSH-Ohio, Lions Clubs International Foundation, Ohio Sight & Hearing, Ohio Diabetes Fund, North West Ohio Eyecare, Lions International Relations. Donations to Harmon Field stadium, financial help to purchase a community parking lot, supported building dam at Harmon Field. Provides glasses for children and other persons with limited funds. Presented a sight-testing machine to the public schools. Presented a reading machine to the local library. Provided copies of Braille Readers Digests to area blind. Money sent to the local library for purchase of large print books. Financial assistance given as result of tornados in 1965 and 2003. Assistance during floods. Donation to the Bluffton Day Care Center and Mennonite Memorial Home. A great response in collecting monies and pledges for the SightFirst II drive through Lions Clubs International. Collections for the LCI Measles Initiative fund. Encouraged youth to participate in the Peace Poster contest yearly. Food drives to provide can goods and money donations for the food bank. Assisted as security at the Allen County Museum during their Christmas Tree Festival. Planted trees in the Motter Park. Presented dictionaries to the thirdgraders at Bluffton Schools.

Sponsored a charity raffle with funds going to local charities. Funds
