Each Lion is assigned a pathway and is responsible for counting traffic along that pathway for a specified two-hour period during the day.

MAY 21ST MEETING:



The Bluffton Lions Club met on May 21st with speaker for the day, Steve and dog in training Jade, from Pilot Dogs in Columbus. The dogs in training are given 3 chances to become a guide dog, as various trainers work with each dog within the program. A guide dog will be around 2 yrs old before being placed with his owner. Dogs from Pilot Dogs have been placed around the world. Those individuals requesting a dog will go through 4 weeks of training with the dog, if this is their first dog. Pilot Dogs has 5 trainers, each working with around 8 dogs. There are 40 to 45 dogs at the center with placement of 120 dogs each year. It costs around \$10,000 to train each dog. The types of dogs used in this program are Poodles, Golden Retrievers and Labradors. The new expansion of the facility 3 years ago has been quite beneficial both to dogs and to their handlers. Lions clubs have sponsored this program, of which funds to run the program come only from contributions.
