### Board Meeting held October 11th:

Audit committee presented their report with two suggestion that have been implemented.

Dare to Dream auction on November 2<sup>nd</sup> 80% of proceeds go to the bike path with 20% going to other donations. Membership will be stressed at this event.

Chicken BBQ at the Blaze of Lights to order 500 chickens through Ted's Market. Cost of meal \$8.50 Pancake/sausage breakfast in the spring may be moved to later date to coordinate with the craft show. Membership drive in the spring will be planned by Lion Omar Khokhar.

Community meal served 82 persons on October 6<sup>th</sup> with 16 Lions volunteering.

New membership application reviewed from Patty Navin with her being welcomed by the board.

Bluffton Hospital Capital Campaign was discussed. The board approved a pledge of \$15,000 over a five year time period with the Eduction Room to be named in honor of the Bluffton Lions Club. Also the Lions membership will be encouraged to provide a matching gift of \$15,000 for this project.

The Augsburger pathway is under construction with the Lions share of \$24,770 as 20% of the project. Ribbon cutting and dedication will be held October 31<sup>st</sup>.

Preliminary construction cost estimate to develop the Bentley-Kibler-Parkview Pathway is \$374,000 plus a \$78,000 projection for contingency and inflation.

#### LIONS WAY AUGSBURGER PATH CONSTRUCTION



In 2008-2009 the Master Plan funded jointly by Village of Bluffton and Bluffton Lions Club began this development of the Bluffton Pathway System.

In June 2009 the Bluffton Lions Foundation was approved as a 501(c) 3 public charity.

The Charity Corvette Car Raffle fundraiser was created to fund the plan in 2009 and this continued through 2013.

In 2012 the 103 pathway right-a-way was agreed upon between the Norfolk Southern, Springfield Fire Works and Village of Bluffton.

In 2014 the first annual Dare to Dream Wine Tasting and Auction event replaced the Charity Corvette Raffle and this continues today.

In 2014 a matching grant was approved by the Findlay Hancock County Community Foundation for the Lions Way 103 pathway project.
