(Thinking back to 1984 I distinctly remember the festivities at the hotel on Blue Lick Road for the 50th anniversary of the club's founding. Lion Dick Boehr was the master of ceremonies and he kept the hall laughing. The Lions International President came over to the U.S. from Sweden. His plane skidded off the runway while landing in New York; there were no serious injuries, but it made the national news. Later he came here and was the main speaker at our event. I still remember the joke about the Scandinavian nationalities that he told; Lion Ib Thompson, who is Danish, was there and was amused. There were some great members in the club, many of whom have passed away. Lion Coach Burky wrote the newsletter, on a typewriter, of course, and always had some silly humor in it. While looking at his last one, a few days after he had died, I could distinctly hear his voice reading the silly jokes. Lion Jim Ehrman was a backbone for the club, serving on the board for a long time and always on top of things. Long-time members were Lion Paul Stauffer, who conducted my induction, and Lion Forrest Steinman. One evening Lion Forrest wanted to present his guest, his preacher. As happens now to many of us, he started to say the man's name, and then his mind got stuck: "I would like to introduce the minister of my church, " and then nothing more came out of his mouth. He had opened himself up to ridicule and one member shouted, "You would know his name if you went to church more often!".)
