Ordinance Committee Minutes

Village of Bluffton

January 28, 2022, Noon by ZOOM

TOPICS: COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FOR BLUFFTON

From our last meeting: "We will think about what help we need to move ahead in Bluffton, considering the resources we have: 2006 Visioning; Lima Allen County Regional Planning Commission"

•Heard from Shane Coleman (Executive Director) and Cody Doyle (Associate Planner) who described their work with other constituent members of LACRPC in developing Comprehensive Plans. They are currently finishing such with the City of Lima and Village of Elida. As one of the constituents, Bluffton regularly pays dues against which services are charged. This work would be such a service. Mr. Coleman estimates that Bluffton would need to budget about \$4,000 for the work.

•Comprehensive plans have two basic parts: One, the baseline data: census counts, demographics, infrastructure, numbers that indicated the size and status of our Village; and Two, the vision, spirit, and direction of the Village. Part one of such a plan is the primary function LACRPC would fulfill and they are well resourced to do that. Part two would be the primary work of a Bluffton Steering Committee, though LACRPC will support such work as possible.

•The focus of such a Steering Committee would be to elicit community feedback from as broad a range of people as possible. Community surveys, interviews, and focus groups would all be means to gather such feedback. We discussed whether it would be possible to engage Bluffton University – particularly students – in this process. This information would become the heart of the Plan, laying out the vision and direction of our community.

•We have already been collecting names of people from whom we need input for the Bluffton Vision. We will now think about a smaller group of people (likely between 6 and 10) who would make up the Steering Committee for a Bluffton Comprehensive Plan.

-We will send names to Jesse to compile.

MINUTES:

Minutes of the October 7, 2021, meeting were approved as presented. Dima Snyder made the motion to approve; John Rich placed a second. Motion carried.

BUSINESS:

New Board Member Solicitation

Dick Ramseyer gave an update that we are still seeking an additional board member. Several names were suggested.

Allen County Bike and Pedestrian Pathway Guide

Dick reported that funding has come through and the Pathway Guide is expected to be printed soon.

Courier Article, "Bluffton Fares Well"

Dick pointed out the many positives about Bluffton's demographics. It was noted that this is something we can share when talking about Bluffton pathways.

Ohio Bike Route 25 (OHBR25) Status

Joe Sehlhorst has kept in touch with ODOT regarding this project. Kylie Schnipke, Transportation Engineer for ODOT gave the update that OHBR25 has been designated and ODOT is currently working on a signage plan for the route starting with state-maintained roadways. ODOT expects to be working with locals soon regarding signs in their jurisdictions. ODOT hopes to begin construction of the signs in September 2022.

Ohio Action Institute 2022

Prior to the meeting, Dick shared information about the Ohio Action Institute 2022, which is a series of workshops and technical assistance for Ohio cities, villages, townships, or counties interested in developing and adopting a Complete Streets Policy. ODOT now treats pedestrian and bike traffic as part of the transportation system. Jesse went on to explain that the Allen County Health Department is encouraging Bluffton to establish a Complete Streets Committee. Jesse shared a "2022 Creating Healthy Communities Work Plan" which lays out strategies for establishing a Complete Streets Policy. Jesse and Dick suggested that the Bluffton Bike and Pedestrian Pathway Board might be a natural group to take on this committee work.

Potential Future Project - Bike Lanes from Village Park to Lions Way County Line Path

To further the goal of encircling the village with a bike path, discussion was had regarding the possible installation of a bike lane on County Line Road, beginning at the Village Park and extending north until it connects with the Lions Way County Line Path. Jesse reported that ODOT has no issue with the Village adding an asphalt bike lane between the guardrails and the edge of the road (feasibility yet to be determined). It was noted that there will be a "choke point"

as the possible bike lane reached the bridge. Comments from the Board included: "We have preferred building green space between bike paths and roadways." "Even with a designated bike lane, will parents consider it safe for their kids. Do we want to encourage kids to ride their bikes on that stretch of road?" "Could we simply designate the stretch as a shared road with signage." "Might this be a project that Findlay-Hancock Community Foundation would partner on?" Jesse and Dick will do further research. This stretch of roadway could be part of the Complete Streets Committee review.

Lions Way County Line Path - 2021-2022

AEP has pushed forward the timing of their pole replacement project on County Line Road. The current plan is that AEP will complete their work between November 2022 and March 2023, after which time the Lions Way County Line Pathway can be installed between April and May 2023. This is later than hoped. Fund raising is complete for this project. Discussed how to communicate an update on the project. A news release will be sent to the ICON, and a letter will be sent to the subdivisions in that area, explaining the revised plan. It was agreed that we did not need to place a "coming soon" sign.

A revised engineering agreement has been received from Choice One which shows only the costs for the bike path and no longer includes the village portion.

Future Pathway - St. Rt. 103 in 2023

Although the Village didn't enter into the SR103 project with an expectation of Pathway funds, the Village and the PB agreed that a gift of approximately \$100,000 would be a great benefit to the project. Dick led discussion regarding campaign strategy for SR103 Pathway.

- 1) At this point, the plan is to have a Dare To Dream event in 2022 with 80% of the proceeds going to pathway projects and 20% going to fund other Lions Club projects.
- 2) As the Village/ODOT approaches landowners about purchase of right-of-way for the SR103 project, they will share Lions Foundation/Pathway Board information along with an invitation to donate to the SR103 path.
- 3) Because of AEP's delay which postpones construction of County Line Path, we will be starting a new campaign before building the pathway paid for by the previous campaign. We will include information about the anticipated SR103 pathway in the update letter being sent to the residents of the subdivisions in that area.
- 4) Hans Houshower is assisting with writing grant applications to area businesses including Marathon Foundation and perhaps Whirlpool and others.
- 5) The Campaign to be titled SR103 Pathway, will begin the quiet phase in June 2022, and the public phase in September 2022 with potential donations received through 2024.

Meeting Adjourned.

Snow Safety Reminders

Bluffton Public Works Dept. takes pride in providing our residents with safe streets even in the most trying of winter conditions. It is our goal to be prepared and in front of all snow events. The Department has well-trained, experienced employees that understand the importance of Public Safety for both our residents and emergency vehicles. Please note the following to Help Us Help You!

1. First and foremost, pull your cars in your driveway. When 2" or more of snow is

on the ground or expected to fall, pull your cars in the driveway.

- If a Snow Emergency has been declared, and you must park on the street, the Snow Emergency Parking Rules will be in effect. Our Police Dept much prefers compliance over enforcement, but please understand we will enforce the law.
- Parking during a Snow Emergency:
 - On even-numbered calendar days, park on the side of the street that has evennumbered building addresses and
 - On odd-numbered calendar days, park on the side of the street with oddnumbered building addresses
 - All vehicles parked in Village owned parking lots shall be moved at 24-hour intervals until snow is cleaned up.
 <u>The Police Department may cause any vehicle to be towed that is not in compliance at the owner's expense.</u>

2. Do not shovel or blow snow into public streets.

This not only defeats the purpose of our snow plowing, it causes unsafe conditions for **all** drivers and makes subsequent snow removal efforts difficult.

- ★ We ask all residents when clearing your driveway and walks, place the snow in your yard or in the tree lawn, not the street.
- ★ Depositing snow on the street simply adds more to your drive after the next plowing cycle. Patience and cooperation during the snow removal season is a benefit to all.

3. Remove snow from sidewalks and hydrants.

If you live in a portion of the Village with sidewalks, please remove snow and ice from your sidewalk within a timely manner (24 hours after snowfall stops). It is the responsibility of every owner, lessee, tenant, occupant or other person having charge of any building or lot of property in the Village abutting upon any public way or public place to remove the snow and ice from the sidewalk in front of said building or lot of property.

Clear snow and ice away from fire hydrants located on or near your property. Keeping hydrants clear will help save valuable time, should a fire emergency occur in your neighborhood.

4. <u>Blocked Driveways</u>. We know it is frustrating to shovel your driveway and then have the plow come by and push snow back at the base. However, to clear the road, all snowplows angle the same way – to the driver's right. When going by they cannot avoid pushing the snow in front of a driveway.

The resident is responsible for access to their driveway. As you prepare to clear your driveway, keep in mind that the snowplow will likely return and push snow and ice back up onto your driveway. Most likely AFTER you have shoveled your driveway. Having to shovel the driveway a second time after the snowplow passes can be frustrating.

There are ways to prevent this:

1. Either, clear an area before your driveway large enough for the snow coming off the blade to be deposited. We realize this may duplicate your efforts, but it is unavoidable as we make roads safe for travel. Shoveling your snow to the right-hand side (as you look out to the street) may prevent most of your work being "plowed in".

Avoid the "Second Shovel"



2. Or, the only way to avoid extra

shoveling is to wait until Village crews have completed their final clean up on the street.

5. If possible, stay off the road.

As much as possible, please avoid driving or parking on the road during heavy snowstorms. Our primary purpose is to clear streets for emergency vehicles. The less traffic our drivers encounter, the faster and more efficiently they can clear the streets.

If you must be out, please use extreme caution. Many motorists drive too fast for conditions or try to stop too quickly. Drive slowly and watch at intersections. Turn on your headlights when precipitation starts. Do not follow our plows too closely. State law requires that you **stay at least 200 feet** behind a working snowplow. When following a snowplow, make sure that you can see the driver's mirrors, so the driver is able to see you. Use extreme caution in passing our plowing and salting equipment.

- ★ We encourage all residents to please **assist your elderly neighbors** with snow removal tasks whenever possible.
- ★ Please remind children playing in the snow or building snow forts, snowmen, etc., to stay away from the street.

How to Take Back Control of Your Data

The Ohio Attorney General's Office recognized Data Privacy Week last month (January 24-28, 2022). In an effort to help Ohioans protect their personal information, the office is reprinting below an edited version of an article published by the National Cybersecurity Alliance.

From social media to online shopping, our lives and the digital world become more and more intertwined. Yes, the digital world provides convenience, but it's important to know how to protect personal data to ensure that it's being used the right way by the right people.

In the latest consumer privacy survey from technology manufacturer Cisco, <u>86% of individuals</u> say they care about their data privacy. That said, even the most savvy digital users can have trouble managing their data.

Here are a few steps to better manage your personal information and make informed decisions regarding your data and how it is used.

Understand the privacy/convenience tradeoff

Many apps, even before you use their services, ask for access to your geographic location, contacts list, photo album and other personal information. This data has tremendous value to businesses, allowing some to even offer you their services at little to no cost.

Consumers should decide whether or not to share their data by weighing the amount of personal information being sought against the benefits they might yield in return. Be thoughtful about who gets your personal information and wary of apps or services that require access to information that is not required or relevant for the services they're offering.

Manage your privacy

Once you have decided to use an app or set up a new account, check the privacy and security settings on the app or website and set them to your comfort level for information sharing. Each device, app or browser may have different features to limit how and with whom you share information.

That said, with so many settings to manage, it can be very challenging to stay on top of them all. Here are some important ones to focus on first:

- Location data: In order to provide more relevant results, many apps ask you to share your location data. Make sure you that share this information only with apps you trust and that the apps are using your data responsibly. Also, pay attention to when the app uses your location information. Many apps give you a choice to always keep your location information on, never have it on only when using the app.
- **Contacts data:** Many email apps and video-conferencing apps allow individuals to automatically sync their existing contacts with their services. Again, be sure that you share this data only with trusted sources, as the data you're choosing to share may belong to others.
- **Camera and photo data:** Social media apps universally ask for access to an individual's photo library and related camera data which, of course, contains troves of private information. Share it with only the most trusted sources, and, through the settings, control the photos to which those apps have access.

A couple of other suggestions: Be sure to delete unused apps on your devices and keep all apps secure by performing updates.

Most Common Complaints of 2021

The Ohio Attorney General's Office works every day to protect families from unfair and deceptive business practices and scams. The office accepts and handles complaints to assist consumers and businesses in reaching a mutual agreement to resolve issues. In 2021, the office received more than 20,500 complaints.

The Consumer Protection Section tracks complaints in several general categories for reporting purposes. In 2021, the categories generating the most complaints were:

- 1. Motor vehicles
- 2. Shopping, food or beverages
- 3. Professional services
- 4. Home or property improvement
- 5. Collections, credit reporting or financial services
- 6. Utilities, phone, internet or TV services

Consumer complaints are typically handled by specialists using an informal dispute-resolution process. A complaint specialist attempts to resolve the dispute by working with the consumer and the business. Complaint resolution might involve, for example, a refund for the consumer or an adjustment of charges or services.

Complaint specialists are trained to identify problems. If there appears to be a consistent pattern of deceptive behavior, the office may investigate further and possibly take legal action against the business on behalf of all Ohioans. This legal action can be taken in order to stop current bad conduct, prevent future misconduct, or obtain restitution or civil penalties. In addition to helping individual consumers, in 2021 the office continued to take complaints from small businesses and nonprofit organizations.

AG Yost's Consumer Protection Wins in 2021:

- Th Civil Investigative Unit opened 146 cases, and the Civil Legal Unit filed 42 lawsuits, obtaining more than \$37 million in judgments.
- The Economic Crimes Unit continued to identify, investigate and prosecute scam artists, opening 393 criminal investigative matters. Working with local law enforcement and county prosecutors, the unit filed four indictments and obtained three convictions. These cases resulted in more than \$465,000 in consumer restitution orders.

- The Elder Justice Unit continued to provide leadership and advocacy to combat elder abuse and exploitation throughout the state by aiding in investigations, forensic analysis, case presentation and prosecution, victim advocacy and assistance, and training and technical assistance. The unit conducted 45 trainings and presentations, reaching 3,469 attendees.
- The Robocall Enforcement Unit encourages Ohioans to not answer or reply to phone numbers they do not recognize. Using a complaint process designed specifically to empower Ohioans to report illegal robocalls, the unit analyzes complaint data to try stop illegal and unwanted calls and texts. The unit received more than 23,000 unwanted call reports in 2021. AG Yost's dedication to combatting robocalls was aided with the passage of Senate Bill 54, which provides additional tools to allow the attorney general to prosecute the use of illegal robocalls with the intent to defraud, cause harm, or wrongfully obtain anything of value.

Beware of Romance Scams This Valentine's Day

Valentine's Day is right around the corner, and for many the day serves as a reminder that they are single. That, in turn, can provide motivation for some people to seek out that special someone – and con artists know it.

It's important to protect your heart and your hard-earned money by watching out for online romance – or "sweetheart" – scams to protect your heart and your hard-earned money.

Romance scams typically originate with a phony profile on a dating website or social media as way of attracting unsuspecting victims.

Many con artists claim to be in another state or country, pretending to be a military member stationed overseas or a businessperson working in another country. They might even send fake photos or documentation to "prove" their identity.

Scammers might spend many hours communicating with a victim before asking for money. Or they might request money for airfare to visit, pay a hospital bill, get out of a foreign country or access an inheritance that the scammers promise to share with their victims.

Victims generally are asked to send money using a gift card, wire-transfer service, money order, prepaid card or other hard-to-trace payment method. Once the money is sent, it is nearly impossible to recover.

In 2021, 41 Ohioans reported to the Attorney General's Office sweetheart scam losses totaling almost \$1.7 million.

In one instance, a Ravenna man sent upward of \$300,000 to a woman he met on the internet over the course of seven years via Western Union transfer, MoneyGram, cash in the mail, gift cards, and Bitcoin. She has asked him for money for a new car, plane tickets and new homes.

In another romance scam, a Franklin County woman was scammed out of \$5,000. The initial contact was made through an online Scrabble game with a social component. The criminals asked her to buy gift cards from Google Play, Apple, eBay and other companies.

Victims of such scams fit no pattern; they may be male or female, young or old. The common denominator is that they believe in love and believe the romance is legitimate.

Here are some ways to avoid sweetheart scams:

- Research someone you meet online; do not rely solely on what that person tells you. Conduct
 internet searches, including reverse image searches, and check with independent sources to
 verify the person's claims.
- Be cautious of love bombing. Love bombing is a manipulation tactic done by showering a new love interest with affection and/or compliments. Be cautious of individuals who claim that destiny or fate brought you together or claim to love you after a short time.
- Be especially wary if you have just lost a loved one; many times, scammers scour through obituaries to find people who have recently suffered a loss.
- Talk to friends and family members about any online relationships, even if the other person asks you to keep the relationship a secret.
- Don't send money to someone you have met only online, even if you have developed a relationship with the individual.
- Be very skeptical of requests for money sent via wire transfer, Bitcoin, peer-to-peer payment systems, money order, prepaid money cards or gift cards. These are preferred payment methods for scammers.

Business Impersonation Scams Are on the Rise

Consumers choose to work with businesses they trust, but that trust can be wiped out in an instant by an impersonation scam. Fraudsters know that consumers are more likely to click on a link that appears to come from a trusted business.

In some instances, the scammer impersonates a popular online business with which many people have accounts. The scammer might call, text or send an email to confirm a purchase that the scammer knows the consumer did not make. After the consumer says that he or she did not make the purchase, the scammer asks the consumer for his/her banking information to initiate the refund process. Instead of refunding money, however, the scammer takes money from the consumer's account.

Here are some ways to avoid a business impersonation scam:

- Check your accounts first before clicking on a link. If you receive an unusual text or email claiming to be from a trusted business, do not click on the link in the message. Check your accounts though verified websites or phone numbers to make sure that the accounts are intact and that you have not purchased any unwanted items. Something to look for: Many times a fake link contains a slight misspelling or differs slightly in other ways from the legitimate website.
- Never call back an unknown number. Use the information on the company website and not a number listed in an unexpected email or text.
- Don't pay a stranger with a gift card. If anyone asks you to pay with a gift card, it's likely a scam.
- Don't give remote access to someone who contacts you unexpectedly. The contact might claim to be from a government office, computer repair company or popular online store. Remote access to your computer or other electronic devices gives scammers easy access to your personal and financial information, such as bank account information.

Also, keep in mind that "phishing" emails and "smishing" texts are commonplace. These are communications typically meant to trick the consumer into clicking on links in a message so the sender can steal personal information and/or money.

For example, you may receive an email or text message instructing you to click on a link to confirm your account information. The message will likely include a threat that you must do this within a limited period of time or your account will be suspended. By entering your username and password on a fake account, the scammer can then steal your personal information to gain access to your account.

If you get an unwanted email or text messages claiming to be a business, there are four ways to report it:

- · Report it on the messaging app you use. Look for the option to report junk or spam.
- Copy the message and forward it to 7726 (SPAM).

- Report it to the Federal Trade Commission at <u>ReportFraud.ftc.gov</u>.
- Report it to the Ohio Attorney General's Office at <u>www.OhioProtects.org</u>.
