Topics: Memorial dedications, shelter house/town hall reservation, SR 103 right-of-way

Minutes:

- The committee met to discuss options for memorial benches/swings in our parks and along our pathways. Several residents have expressed interest recently and so we are trying to find quality options that the Village can take ownership of, while still being at a reasonable cost for residents. Our main stumbling block is finding options that include shade without being cost prohibitive.
- Committee recommends opening the reservations process for the shelter houses and third floor of Town Hall. Both will require the same process as before, with an added acknowledgement of the renter's intention to follow current COVID-related protocols.
 The committee suggests adding signs at the shelter houses to remind renters.
- Acquisition costs are still being determined, conversations with consultants indicate that the cost per square foot may be higher than initially estimated.

Minutes:

- Pool resolution wording
 - Kevin informed the committee on the number of W2s the Village sent out this
 year, adjusting for duplicate addresses. We discussed the intention behind
 changing the wording and walked through several scenarios with various
 language to see what the impact would be, e.g., "non-elected employees", "non-seasonal staff".
 - After narrowing in on a desire to explicitly show recognition/appreciation for our first responders, the final suggested wording will add "members of Safety Services (PD, EMS, FD)".
 - By our count, this will add 5 part-time police officers and 34 fire/EMS households to the current list of 29 full-time employees.
 - This benefit can be extended at zero cost to the Village. However, at the current value of \$155 for a family pass, there is a potential for \$6,045 of lost revenue if every recipient would have otherwise purchased a pass; which has not been the case historically.
- St Rte 103 pathway land appraisal
 - Land appraisal numbers have come in, based on comps from recent sales along St Rte 103 in Bluffton and Country Rd 199 in Findlay. The total cost is higher than initially anticipated, but the administration is continuing to look into additional sources of funding (recent legislation authorizing grant applications). Also, looking at ways to recognize property owners if they would choose to make a donation to the pathway, similar to recognition for donors along other multi-use paths.
 - The Parks & Rec Committee remains in support of this project and its transformation of that corridor, as well as its role in setting the stage for future improvements.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE 2021 FISCAL YEAR FOR THE VILLAGE OF BLUFFTON, OHIO AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

SECTION 2: That an emergency exists for the reasons set forth in this Ordinance.

SECTION 2: The effective date of these appropriations shall be March 22, 2021.

SECTION3: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3: Pool personnel who complete the season will be reimbursed for fees associated with the certification/recertification of CPR and lifeguard training for up to \$100.00 expended in same year. Receipts for the reimbursement must be turned into the Pool Manager who will submit them to the Fiscal Officer's office for reimbursement processing at the end of the pool season. Reimbursement will be subject to approval from manager.

Jefferson Street Phase II ROAD CLOSURE NOTICE

SR 103/Jefferson St. from the County Line Rd. to Main St. will be closed **beginning on Monday March 29**th until the end of July.

- Project will consist of road reconstruction, installation of new sanitary and storm sewer, along with curbs and sidewalks.
- Will be applying for a loan supplement of \$22,516.96 from OWDA. Re-bid from Underground
 Utilities had more costs associated with eligible items (sanitary and storm facilities) than
 previous bid used to calculate this loan. (\$432,160.63 compared to \$409, 643.67)

Allen County Tax Incentive Review Council (TIRC): Met on March 17, 2021 and renewed two tax abatement agreements with to Diamond Manufacturing. The agreements expire in 2022 and 2026.

Water Meter Updates - Radio Replacement

An issue has been discovered with the battery life on the newly installed radio transceivers throughout town. All units are being replaced as part of the equipment warranty through Sensus.

This replacement is being performed by Advanced Utility Service (AUS).

- No interruptions in service will occur with this project.
