### AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE A EWING STREET AS REQUESTED BY JEAN AND THOMAS BERNHOFT AND REBECCA AND JAMES SHEPLER.

WHEREAS: Jean and Thomas Bernhoft and Rebecca and James Shepler have petitioned for the vacation of a Ewing Street that is adjacent to their properties that is no longer necessary for public access; and

WHEREAS: O.R.C. § 723.04 provides as follows:

The legislative authority of a municipal corporation, on petition by a person owning a lot in the municipal corporation praying that a street or alley in the immediate vicinity of such lot be vacated or narrowed, or the name thereof changed, upon hearing, and upon being satisfied that there is good cause for such change of name, vacation, or narrowing, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest, and that it should be made, may, by ordinance, declare such street or alley vacated, narrowed, or the name thereof changed. The legislative authority may include in one ordinance the change of name, vacation, or narrowing of more than one street, avenue, or alley.

### IT IS THEREFORE ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BLUFFTON, OHIO THAT:

- **SECTION 1:** The Council of the Village of Bluffton, Ohio finds that, upon petition and hearing on such petition, finds that there is good cause for such vacation of Ewing Street and that there is no detriment to the general interest, hereby declares that the said street, as described in the attached exhibit, is and is hereby vacated.
- SECTION 2: That is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were made in open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in accordance with all legal requirements of the Open Meetings Law including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

- WHEREAS, Village of Bluffton also agrees to maintain its membership in the LACRPC and to comply with the Bylaws of the LACRPC and the Bylaws of the Transportation Coordinating Committee of the LACRPC; and,
- WHEREAS, Village of Bluffton agrees to participate in the transportation planning process, and to actively support the public involvement process as it relates to the development and adoption of the MPO's Long Range Transportation Plan, Transportation Improvement Program, Annual Unified Planning Work Program and the publication of an Annual Report.
