ORDINANCE NO. 02-16

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A SURCHARGE ON WATER AND SEWER ACCOUNTS OF THE VILLAGE OF BLUFFTON, OHIO

WHEREAS; the Village of Bluffton has examined and reviewed the costs of operation and distribution of water services and sewer services and finds that those costs have increased substantially and that the relevant funds require substantial support from General Fund Revenue, thereby reducing funding available for other essential governmental functions, and,

WHEREAS; the Village of Bluffton finds it necessary and proper that the water and sewer funds become self supporting;

IT IS THEREFORE ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BLUFFFTON, OHIO AS FOLLOWS:

- **SECTION 1.** That there shall be a surcharge on each and every water and/or sanitary sewer connection for which the Village of Bluffton, Ohio provides water services and/or sanitary sewer services each billing cycle, commencing July of 2016 and each and every month thereafter.
- **SECTION 2.** That the surcharge will be reflected on each account's monthly billing statement and shall be due and payable on the same date with other Village Utility bills for water, sewer and refuse services.
- **SECTION 3.** That any and all surcharge funds collected by the Village of Bluffton, Ohio shall be designated for water and sewer operations or water and sewer capital.
- **SECTION 4.** That the surcharge will be based upon the size of Water Meter that records water usage for each account at the following monthly rates per meter and the allocation of the surcharge between the Water Fund and the Sewer Fund. Connections for sanitary sewer service only will be billed the sewer surcharge for the 5/8" meter. Connections outside of the Village of Bluffton will be billed double the inside rate.

SECTION 5. Existing Water Meters shall remain in place. In order to change the size of any Water Meter that is in place as of the date that this Ordinance becomes

effective, the person requesting the change must make application, in writing, to the Village Administrator. That application must contain the property location, account number, name and contact information for the applicant and such other information as required by the Village Administrator. The Village Administrator will review the application and will grant the same only under the following conditions:

- a. That the application contains good cause for the change in Water Meter size.
- b. That the mere desire to lessen the surcharge enacted herein will not be deemed good cause.
- c. That, if granted, the applicant shall be solely responsible for cost of the new meter and the labor for installation of the same by the Village. The Village shall retain ownership of the Water Meter.

SECTION 6: it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were made in open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in accordance with all legal requirements of the Open Meetings Law including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

County Line Road RR Crossing

Representatives from the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio- Rail Division have scheduled an on-site diagnostic review of the County Line Road rail crossing at the end of April. This crossing was considered for upgrades a few years ago but there were some questions regarding the data that had been compiled. The crossing has once again come up on their radar and the meeting will be to discuss if the crossing needs to be upgraded to flashing lights and roadway gates using federal funds. I am in the process of gathering information from the local school districts that may or may not have school buses that use the crossing. I would like to thank Thom Mazur from the Lima-Allen County Regional Planning Commission for providing an excellent, detailed summary of the crossing conditions when I simply requested traffic count numbers.

Mulch Availability

Now that the weather is improving, we are having more residents seeking to get mulch. While residents are welcome to load their own mulch, many ask for assistance from the members of the Service Department. However, during the day, the Service Department is often not available at the garage as they are out working on various projects throughout the Village. The best times to catch them at the shop are: first thing in the morning, between 7:00 and 7:30 AM; 11:30 AM; 1:00 PM; and 3:30 PM. Trailers that are left unattended will not be filled by the Service Department.

Alley Vacation Hearing

We need to schedule an Alley Vacation Hearing for the alley between Grove and Kibler Streets that was recommended by the Streets and Alleys Committee to vacate.

Planning Commission Meeting

The Planning Commission has a meeting scheduled for Monday, May 9th at 8:00 PM to review the Construction Drawings for the Parkview Development that was approved by the Planning Commission and the Village Council in 2007.

Arbor Day Celebration

Attached to this report is a proclamation from the office of the Mayor in recognition of Arbor Day. Arbor Day 2016 is Friday, April 29th. The Bluffton Tree Commission will be celebrating Arbor Day with a tree planting on Saturday, April 30th at 10:00 AM at the Village Arboretum on Lake Street.

Spring Cleanup

The Annual Spring Clean-up has been scheduled for May 20th-May 31st. The dumpsters are scheduled to be delivered on Friday, May 20th and be changed out as needed before being removed on Tuesday, May 31st. Items that may not be disposed of in the dumpsters include hazardous materials (motor oil, paint, etc.), vehicle batteries, and tires. Appliances that use Freon, such as refrigerators, will not be accepted unless it is certified that the Freon has been legally removed and disposed of. The use of the dumpsters is reserved for Village residents only. Village employees may randomly verify that individuals utilizing the dumpsters are residents of the Village.
