# **Public Hearing**

The Public Hearing scheduled for Monday evening at 8:30 PM is to consider the Planning Commission's recommendation to approve a petition to rezone property located at 582 Harmon Road from Residential-I to Residential-II as requested by Heidi Hotmire, the owner of the property. It is Mrs. Hotmire's intention, following approval of the zone classification change, to seek approval from the Board of Building and Zoning Appeals for a conditional use to utilize the property for the purposes of a medical office. The Planning Commission held a Public Hearing on April 25, 2012 to consider the petition and voted unanimously to recommend the approval of the petition. Following the Council Hearing, per the Zoning Ordinance, "Council shall consider such recommendations and vote on the passage of the proposed amendment to the text of the ordinance or zoning map. The Council may overrule the recommendations of the Commission by four-sixths (4/6) vote of the full membership of the Council".

# S. Main/N. Dixie Hwy. Projects

The Water and Sewer projects on S. Main Street/N. Dixie Hwy. are 99% complete. There are a few minor wrap-up items to be completed. I will be sending notices to property owners next week (week of June 25<sup>th</sup>) advising them that the sanitary sewer is ready to be tapped into. We will be working with the Allen County Health Department on coordinating inspections as properties abandon their existing septic systems and connect to the sanitary sewer main line. Per Health Department practice, property owners will have 90 (ninety) days to connect to the sanitary sewer.

### **Consumer Confidence Report**

The Consumer Confidence Report will be sent to water customers by July 1<sup>st</sup>. This is the annual, required mailing that includes the water quality data from both the Ottawa Public Water System and the Bluffton Distribution System. Included with the CCR will be a notice regarding the TTHM sampling results that exceeded the annual average limit during the first quarter of 2012.

### **Bid Opening**

The Bid Opening for the Grove and Cherry waterline projects is scheduled for Thursday, June 28<sup>th</sup> at 11:00 AM at the Town Hall. The intention is to be prepared, pending State paperwork, to award the contracts for the projects at the July 9<sup>th</sup> Council meeting.
