### **RESOLUTION NO. 15-16**

### A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND AFFIRM THE BLUFFTON POLICE DEPARTMENT'S PARTICIPATION IN THE "1033 PROGRAM" AND AUTHORIZING THE CHIEF OF POLICE AS ITS AGENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the United States Government, through the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) periodically has excess, surplus or unused equipment that can be made available for local law enforcement to utilize for proper government functions; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Bluffton, through the Bluffton Police Department, has received equipment through the "1033 Program" or the "LESO Program" administered by the Disposition Services, Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO); and

WHEREAS, the Village of Bluffton, through the Bluffton Police Department, has participated in and benefited from this program since at least August, 1997.

### NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BLUFFTON, OHIO:

Section 1: The Bluffton Village Council, as the governing body of the Village of Bluffton, recognizes and affirms the Bluffton Police Department's participation in the "1033 Program" or other names similar programs for purposes of receiving and utilizing excess, surplus, or unused equipment for proper governmental functions; and The Bluffton Village Council, as the governing body of the Village of Section 2: Bluffton, authorizes the Chief of Police as its agent for this program. **Section 3:** That an emergency exists in the daily operation of the Village whereby failure to act will be detrimental to the public health, welfare and safety of the inhabitants thereof. **Section 4:** That it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code. erning

### **OEPA BCA Termination**

I received a copy via email of a letter dated August 10, 2016 from the Ohio EPA notifying the Village that the Ohio EPA Division of Drinking and Ground Waters is terminating the Bilateral Compliance Agreement which became effective on May 26, 2015. The DDAGW has verified that all outstanding obligations under the Bilateral Compliance Agreement have been performed. The agreement was in place regarding the TTHM levels and gave the Village until December 31, 2016 to bring the TTHM levels into compliance. A copy of the letter is attached to this report.

### **Airport Sealing**

I received a quote from Nonnemaker Asphalt Sealcoating to seal the asphalt at the airport that was paved last year. The airport commission is wanting to paint a compass rose on the apron this year, and the asphalt needs to be sealed before they paint. I asked for, and received, a quote to simply seal the area where the compass rose would be placed and that could be done for \$875.90. To seal all of the asphalt that needs to be sealed, the quotes came to \$17,425.55 and\$15,377.25, with the only difference being the method of application on the first of two coats. In talking with Richland Engineering, I believe we could advise the FAA of our intent to perform the sealcoating this year to protect the asphalt and investment, and apply for a reimbursing grant next year to cover the costs, as long as it is performed to FAA specifications, which the quote includes. At this time, I am recommending to Council that we advance money to the airport improvement fund to pay to sealcoat the asphalt now and apply for a reimbursing grant to the FAA next year in order to repay the advancement.

### Crosswalks

The Village is expecting our order of paint to be delivered on Friday, August 12<sup>th</sup>. In the next two weeks, as the weather permits, the Service Department will be repainting the crosswalks and curbs, as needed, in the areas where we paint the crosswalks and curbs, which is primarily in the area around the schools.
