Preliminary Consent Legislation

Ordinance #_11-15
County/Route/Section: ALL Augsburger Rd Bikepath

The following is an ordinance enacted by the <u>Village of Bluffton</u>, <u>Allen</u> County, Ohio, hereinafter referred to as the Local Public Agency (LPA), in the matter of the stated described project.

SECTION I - Project Description

WHEREAS, the LPA has identified the need for the described project:

This project proposes to:

 Construct a 10 feet wide walk-bike pathway from the existing pedestrian facilities in the village to the senior center and subdivision housing.

WHEREAS, a portion of described project is within the Village corporation limits.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Village of Bluffton of Allen County, Ohio.

SECTION II - Consent Statement

Being in the public interest, the LPA gives consent to the Director of Transportation to complete the above described project.

SECTION III - Cooperation Statement

The LPA shall cooperate with the Director of Transportation in the above described project as follows:

The LPA hereby agrees to pay for the entire cost of the improvement, less the amount of State Highway funds allocated to this project by the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT). In the event that the LPA requests certain features or appurtenances to be included within the project's design and/or construction, and which features and appurtenances are determined by the State to be not necessary for the project, the LPA shall contribute 100% of the cost of those items.

SECTION IV - Utilities and Right-of-Way Statement

The LPA agrees that all right-of-way required (if applicable) for the described project will be acquired and/or made available in accordance with current State and Federal regulations. The LPA also understands that right-of-way costs include eligible utility costs.

The LPA agrees that all utility accommodations, relocations and reimbursements will comply with the current provisions of 23 CFR 65 and the ODOT Utilities Manual.

SECTION V - Maintenance

Maintain the right-of-way and keep it free of obstructions, and hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.

SECTION VI - Authority to Sign

Legislation

Ordinance No. 11-15 represents preliminary consent legislation with the Ohio Department of Transportation for the Augsburger Pathway Project that is a requirement of ODOT that the Village approve.

Ordinance No. 12-15 is legislation that Steve Chamberlain created to designate and authorize the Stop Signs located on County Line Road at the railroad crossing that Chief Skilliter requested.

Ordinance No. 13-15 is legislation that Steve Chamberlain created to address the possible elimination of the parking spaces on the East and West sides of Main Street just South of the College Avenue intersection that was discussed to attempt to improve the visibility at that intersection.

Ordinance No. 14-15 is legislation that Steve Chamberlain created to address a request from the Bluffton Local Schools District to designate parking spaces on S. Jackson Street in front of the Bluffton High School's West entrance as handicap parking only.

Street Markings

Zimmerman Painting is scheduled to be in prior to August 31st to: remove and replace the crosswalks at the intersections of Main Street and College Avenue, Cherry/Church. Elm, Jefferson, Vine and Franklin Streets; remove and replace the stop lines at the intersections of Main Street and College Avenue, Church/Cherry, Elm and Jefferson Streets; remove and replace the School Zone markings on Main Street; and install yield line markings on Main Street at the crosswalks at College Avenue and Vine Street. Zimmerman will be utilizing Thermoplastic rather than paint. The Service Department is scheduled to repaint the existing crosswalks, curbs, and stop bars next week, weather permitting.

Pool

Just a reminder, the final day that the pool will be open this Sumer is Sunday, August 23rd. There was an article in the Lima News earlier this week that reported that most local pools are in the process of closing now. Most other pools are in the same situation that we are in in that we begin losing our staff as colleges, universities and local school districts begin class well in advance of Labor Day, which used to be the de facto end of the pool season

Maple Grove Drainage

On Tuesday, August 4, 2015, Councilmen Johnson and Warren met with myself and members of the Service Department at Maple Grove Cemetery to further discuss and explain the proposed pipe bursting project to replace a deteriorated storm sewer line along the North edge of the cemetery that was discussed at the August 3, 2015 Council Meeting. At the conclusion of the discussion, both Mr. Johnson and Mr. Warren indicated that they were in favor of moving forward with the project. EJP, Inc. came onsite this week to fuse the line together ahead of time and J&D Snyder Excavating should be in in the next week or two to install the new line.

Resignation

Crosswalk Update

The police department had available roughly 500 copies of the crosswalk brochure available for distribution at the National Night Out event last week. We still have a considerable number of the brochures available. I did receive a quote to print additional brochures, but I do not currently see a need to commercially print more brochures. (Our supply currently seems to be meeting the local demand). We will still have enough brochures to send home with school children when the assembly is held.

I attended a meeting with state and local officials about the intersection. At the present time, we are continuing down the path charted at the last meeting (signage, education, etc.)

I did walk Main Street with Mr. Mehaffie to determine the likely areas needing additional signage or restricted parking. Likewise, we looked at the parking along the high school property and have proposed legislation that will be discussed at the council meeting.
