ORDINANCE NO. 15-12

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING, ENACTING AN AMENDMENT TO THE OHIO BASIC CODE AS ADOPTED BY THE VILLAGE OF BLUFFTON, OHIO TO ADD AN OFFENSE OF INTOXICATION AS DEFINED HEREIN AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

- WHEREAS, the Village of Bluffton finds that the Ohio Basic Code as adopted by the Village of Bluffton, Ohio should be amended in include a intoxication as an offense, and:
- WHEREAS, an emergency exists in that the new law is needed for the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the Village of Bluffton, Ohio.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BLUFFTON, OHIO at least five of the members elected thereto concurring THAT:

Section 1. That the Ohio Basic Code as enacted by the Village of Bluffton shall be amended to include the following section:

132.20 INTOXICATION.

(a) No person shall be found in the state of intoxication or, being intoxicated, shall disturb the peace and good order or shall conduct himself or herself in a disorderly manner.

(b) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor.

- Section 2. That an emergency exists in the operation of the Village whereby failure to act will be detrimental to the public health, welfare and safety of the inhabitants thereof.
- Section 3. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public incompliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

FEMA Declaration

Per Russ Decker, director of the Allen County Office of Homeland Security & Emergency Management, FEMA has issued a major disaster declaration for 37 Ohio counties, including Allen, for emergency response and clean-up costs associated with the severe thunderstorm of June 29, 2012 and the subsequent extended power outages. The federal assistance available is for local governments and certain non-profits only. No individual assistance has been authorized. I will be attending an Applicants Briefing on September 5, 2012 in order to begin the process for reimbursement of eligible costs. This FEMA Declaration represents the third Disaster Declaration that the Village has been a part of since January of 2005: the January 2005 Ice Storm, the August 2007 Flood and now the June 2012 Derecho. This Declaration (DR-4077) was issued on Monday, August 20, 2012-on the five-year anniversary of the August 2007 Flood.
