Phenology:

This month we will be having a presentation on phenology by Hancock County Master Gardener Bill Jones. Bill maintains the Phenology Garden for the O.S.U. Extension in Hancock Co. and keeps the records on when things occur in the garden. This important in that we need to know when things happen so we can do what needs to be done in a timely manner. Phenology records shows us how the climate and it's ever fluctuating changes affects plants and animals of our area.

I don't know how many times that I have been asked when someone should do something like spray for certain insects, or when it would be safe to plant. Through phenology we should be able to know when insects will emerge and at what growth stage they are properly control them.

Bees:

Dwight Wilson gave us a good presentation on honeybees at our April 5th meeting. Honeybees are our major pollinators of fruits and vegetables. Bees produce honey which is made by concentrating nectar with the removal of water in the gut of the bees. Bees also gather pollen which they use as food, but they are so efficient in their gathering that Dwight can harvest it and make it available to those who use it as a supplement. Bees also produce a product called propolis that is used for it's medicinal qualities.
