Casting a Leaf:

I do not know what the formula of the casting material will be but it probably be either cement or a hyper-tufa like product. Planting/Growing Now:

As the year races by we try to keep up with the schedule that we have set for ourselves and often we are able to do what we want to when we need to but some things never seem to get done when we want them to. This isn't always bad. If you weren't able to plant zucchinis don't fret because if you have the seed go ahead and plant it now and you will not have to worry about that plant dying because of squash vine borer. Since they only have one hatch a year and that has happened, your now in the clear and you should have a good crop of late zucchini and it should produce till frost. You will still have to control squash bugs. The black raspberries are basically done soon we will have blackberries. Beans and corn can still be planted and it is always good to plant flowers whenever we can, even if they won't bloom until September. Have fun and plant something.
