Dues:

This is to inform you that the dues that we pay to the Gardeners of America, the Central Great lakes region and our local Gardeners of the Bluffton/Pandora Area are due. We need to pay these dues as soon as possible so we can remain in good standing. These dues are for the year 2019 and there is no increase and they are as follows: the national dues are \$15.00 with \$8.00 for an additional family member and \$5.00 for youth memberships; the Central Great Lakes Region is \$1.00 for each member; our local dues are \$5.00 per address. So for those of you who are a single member the total is \$21.00, for those who are two members same address \$30.00 and those who are life members of the national only have to pay \$6.00 for their dues. Please have the dues sent to me at the address on the envelope by November 21 so I can take care of paying them by December.

Bulb Forcing Program:

We have set the program for November and here is what we have for this year. Master Gardener Volunteer/MGV Dr. Richard Deerhake will do the program, this is good as Dick is said to be a premier bulb planter. MGVs Jeri Wenger, Debra Evans and Tim Brugeman will assist with set-up, helping participants plant the bulbs and clean-up. Dick will do the presentation, he is very excited to do this program. I hope we have a good attendance. We and the Library should promote the program maybe in newspapers and other means as open to the public, with all registrations to go thru the Library. This would be a good PR opportunity to maybe get new members and for the Library doing community educational programs.

The FEE will be \$12.00 each, payable to Gardeners of the Bluffton – Pandora Area. This includes bulbs (about 10-12 bulbs) they choose when they register, special bulb potting soil and handouts.

Choice is either Hyacinth, Tulips or Daffodils (no mixing). Pots will be all one kind.

Participants must bring their own planter pot about 12" wide x 4" deep with drainage hole in bottom and water tray. If they want a clay pot and tray (do not have their own pot), it will be an additional \$3 each set.

Feasels of Findlay is getting all the materials ready for us based on final registration they would like by November 1 so we will have a cutoff date of October 30, 2019 for the registration.

We will also need to register with the library so please do so as there will no exceptions. You may want to do this soon as there are some master gardeners interested in doing this program for themselves. These pots make a dreary winter colorful and fragrant and that is good for the soul
