WHEREAS, the Apollo Joint Vocational School Board of Education is comprised of members appointed by each participating school district board of education in accordance with the Apollo Vocational School District plan submitted to the State Board of Education;

WHEREAS, the Bluffton Exempted Village Board of Education is a participating school district board of education entitled to appoint a member to the Apollo Joint Vocational School District Board of Education;

WHEREAS, R.C. 3311.19 requires members of the joint vocational school district board of education to have experience as chief financial officers, chief executive officers, human resources managers, or as other business, industry, or career counseling professionals and be qualified to discuss the labor needs of the region with respect to the regional economy; and

WHEREAS, R.C. 3311.19 requires members of the joint vocational school district board of education to represent the perspectives of employers in the region served by the joint vocational school district and be qualified to consider the state's workforce needs with an understanding of the skills, training, and education needed for current and future employment opportunities in the state; and

WHEREAS, the Board prefers to appoint individuals who have served as members of a Apollo Joint Vocational School District/Career Technology Center Business Advisory Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Board determines that Brad Fruchey has experience and qualification in logistics/trucking industry which is one of the top 7 employers in the region, and has been trained on the labor needs with respect to the local economy; and

WHEREAS, the Board determines Brad Fruchey has experience as a chief financial officer, chief executive officer, human resources manager, or as another business, industry, or career counseling professional; is qualified to discuss the labor needs of the region with respect to the regional economy; represents the perspectives of employers in the region served by the joint vocational school district and is qualified to consider the state's workforce needs with an understanding of the skills, training, and education needed for current and future employment opportunities in the state; and

WHEREAS, R.C. 3311.19 requires members of the joint vocational school board to be selected based on the diversity of the employers from the geographical region of the state in which the territory of the joint vocational school district is located represented by the members and requires not less than three-fifths of the members of the board to reside in or be employed within the territory of the joint vocational school district board;

WHEREAS, the Superintendent has consulted with the superintendent of the Apollo Joint Vocational School District/Career-Technology Center to ensure that the appointment of Brad Fruchey will satisfy the diversity and three-fifths requirements;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Bluffton Exempted Village Board of Education appoints Brad Fruchey to the Apollo Joint Vocational School District Board of Education for a three-year term of office commencing on January 8, 2014.

The Board of Education of the Bluffton Exempted Village School District, Counties of Aller and Hancock, Ohio (the "District"), met in session at p.m., on the 8 th day of January, 2014, at

RESOLUTION DETERMINING TO PROCEED WITH SUBMISSION OF A RENEWAL TAX LEVY WITH

WHEREAS, this board of education at its meeting on the 16th day of December, 2013, by resolution duly adopted, determined the necessity of renewing an existing levy, with an increase of \$248,392 per year, in excess of the ten-mill limitation for the benefit of this school district for the purpose of providing funds for current operating expenses, in order to avoid an operating deficit, to provide proceeds of \$714,392 per year for a five (5) year period, and provided that the question of levying said renewal tax with an increase shall be submitted to the electors of said school district at an election to be held on May 6, 2014; and

INCREASE

WHEREAS, the county auditor has certified to this board of education the total tax valuation of the District and that the estimated average annual levy (assuming that the amount of the tax list of this school district remains throughout the life of the levy the same as the amount of the tax list for the current year) required to produce said annual amount is four and nine-tenths (4.90) mills for each one dollar (\$1.00) of valuation, which amounts to forty-nine cents (\$0.49) for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of valuation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Bluffton Exempted Village School District:

SECTION I. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the submission to the electors of the question of levying the renewal tax with an increase described in the preambles hereto at the election to be held on May 6, 2014.

SECTION 2. That the treasurer of this board of education be and is hereby directed to certify the following to the board of elections: (a) the resolution of this board of education determining the necessity of said tax and said election; (b) this resolution; (c) the amount of the average tax levy, expressed in dollars and cents for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of valuation as well as in mills for each one dollar (\$1.00) of valuation, as calculated and certified by the county auditor, and (d) the number of years said levy is to run and to notify said board of elections to cause notice of such election to be given as required by law.

SECTION 3. That the form of ballot, upon which the question of levying said tax shall be submitted to the electors, shall be as follows:

PROPOSED TAX LEVY (RENEWAL WITH AN INCREASE)

BLUFFTON EXEMPTED VILLAGE SCHOOL DISTRICT

A majority affirmative vote is necessary for passage

Shall a levy renewing \$466,000 and providing an increase of \$248,392 be imposed by the Bluffton Exempted Village School District, FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS FOR CURRENT OPERATING EXPENSES, IN ORDER TO AVOID AN OPERATING DEFICIT, in the sum of \$714,392 per year, and a levy of taxes to be made outside of the ten-mill limitation estimated by the county auditor to average four and nine-tenths (4.90) mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to forty-nine cents (\$0.49) for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for a period of five (5) years, commencing in 2014, first due in calendar year 2015?
