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

Question of the month?

Are Green House Homes Assisted Living or Licensed Nursing Care?

Green House homes provide licensed nursing care. One of the most persistent misunderstandings about the Green House homes is the *level of care* being provided to those who live there. Green House homes are designed to serve those who must have **24 hour care** and who are unable to live on their own. **Elders in the Green House homes will receive Licensed Nursing Care.** Many believe the Green House homes will provide Assisted Living. That is not true. The Green House homes are only for Licensed Nursing Care.

MHCO does provide Assisted Living (AL) at both Maple Crest and Mennonite Memorial Home. Elders residing in AL apartments may receive some assistance with bathing, med administration and other activities of daily living and have daily contact with a staff person. Part of the confusion may be due to the fact that a Green House home does not look like a nursing home! And that's the goal!!! With your help we're *Transforming Elder Care!*

Did you know???

There are seven Work Groups made up of 3-6 staff and volunteers each who are helping to lead the transformation to Green House living. The Green House® Project is a “philosophy of care” even more than a new “living environment.” The “universal worker” known as a *Shabbaz* replaces the nurses aide. A hierarchical staffing structure gives way to a self-directed work team. Elder choice regarding sleep schedule, meals, and activities is enhanced. The living environment is a home. All of this transition requires rewriting many of our policies and procedures since they were written from an “institutional” perspective. Transition is never easy but with a committed team of staff, volunteers and donors, it is possible and it is happening at MHCO to the benefit of our elders!
