#### **MAY DINNER MEETING**

Our tables were brightly decorated with yellow flowers and very, very bright napkins. It sure made one take notice and made you feel very festive. Betty Moser was chairperson for the decorating along with Dave and Lenore Reiter and a few more to help serve. Mary Hofstetter, was our MC, and opened the meeting with some jokes and then a prayer for the meal to follow. We were served pulled bar-be-que pork plus the trimmings with cheesecake for dessert.

After the meal, Mary, acknowledged the May birthdays and anniversaries with singing from the group. Tonya then interviewed our 90 year old member, Richard Glaser and his family. She then spoke about her trips and other happenings at the Center. Bob followed with his trips and etc. Mary then introduced Jill Bland, daughter of Richard, who sang for us a variety of songs. What a nice treat to have your own daughter sing for a half hour to you! Thanks Jill. Mary then wished everyone to return for June's meeting and to check out and sign the worksheets for the Car Show as they were leaving.

Sunday morning, 8:30 a.m., forty-eight (48) people boarded the bus and headed west. Two hours down the road, we stopped for a break and was served homemade cookies by **Bev.** Coffee was from McDonald's at Bluffton or you could have water or both. The cookies were very tasty and such a nice treat! On the bus again, **Bob** and **Bev** had a little worship time (since it was Sunday) by reading a few poems and singing several hymns. We then stopped at Terre Haute, Indiana for lunch. Back on the road and looking for the **Arch** and **St.Louis** for the **Holiday Inn.** Arrived about 5 p.m. and headed to our rooms and a buffet was prepared for our supper or you may order from the menu. Both were very good and several of our group found out what "sliders" were. They ended up with "4" little sandwiches instead of one large one. Wow!! Back to our rooms to stretch out and rest from the 8 hour drive.

Monday morning, we had a hot breakfast (buffet style) and then headed for Anheuser-Bush Brewery for a 2 hour walking tour. It was quite detailed and very, very clean and interesting how beer is processed from barley-hops-rice plus yeast. Next we saw how the packaging process for shipping was done. This company started in 1852 and now has 11 different brewerys across the United States plus ship to other countries. At the end of the tour, we could sample any type of beer they make in their "hospitality room" or any Pepsi product. On the bus and away to Branson but stopping at Lambert's Café first. Arrived at 4 p.m. and our group was seated right away. Looking over the menu, one soon heard a voice calling out "dinner roll" and then one was flying through the air. A young man goes around the restaurant doing this to anyone who wants one and then a girl is following offering warm molasses to eat on it. Wow, the roll with molasses was unbelievable!!! Oh so good! We then picked what meal we wanted: Keith had liver and onions and I had chicken with two sides for me and Keith had two sides. During the meal, girls would come around and offer samples of other sides that you could have. Oh, so full when done and saw little white boxes come along with us on the bus to Branson. Twenty-seven miles to Branson, the sign said, and our home for four nights, Carriage House Inn. Received our room key and refreshed some and off to our first show for the week. Clay Cooper at the Country Express Theater. This was located just up the hill from the Inn and around the corner. It was a very entertaining show with singing, dancing, comedy by Clay and family members. After a two hour show, back on the bus and to our rooms. A big day of traveling and everyone was ready for a good night's sleep.

As we drove into town on Monday, we were greeted with the evidence of the tornado damage Branson received on February 29<sup>th</sup>. Buildings were damaged or completely gone, just a cement slab left, no windows or doors in buildings standing, a pile of lumber f rom something that was there, metal hanging in trees, and large equipment loading piles of lumber and rubble in to dump trucks. We were told about 88 buildings were damaged on the "main strip" of Branson of theaters and restaurants and motels and etc. No lives were lost but some injuries and probably because there weren't many tourists in town at this time of month or up at 1:30 a.m. in the morning. It sure made me think and appreciate what I have!

Tuesday morning started with breakfast at the Inn. At nine o'clock, loaded up and went to the Music City Theater to see the Doug Gabriel show. He and his family do a #1 Hits Theater Show. I really enjoyed this show with music of the 50's and 60's. The one son was the "comedian" for the show doing skits, played drums, sang, and ran the elevator for guests. Mother and daughter ran the gift shop before the show and this is how the whole family is involved with all of the shows plus sing and dance. During the show, Doug came into the audience and picked Carl Hermiller, from our group, to help with a song. Carl did a little wiggle with the beat of the song and everyone was pleased! Was another two hour show and was noon when it was over. Bob and Bev decided since there were eating places in walking distance, that we all could decide where we wanted to go. Keith and I plus others, walked to a small family hamberger/malt shop named, Billy Bob's. Entering the shop, you felt like you were back in the 50's with "Betty Boop" items and Coke items for decorations. A working jukebox in the corner playing the old songs. Sandwiches were GREAT along with the chocolate shake. Back on the bus and to the Branson Craft Mall. We were to see local craft people doing their craft such as leather, wreath design, jewelry, silversmith, and decorating t-shirts and more. There were only three working but it was interesting to look at the crafts that were done. Each person received a wooden rose bud when we left. Returned to the Inn for a little rest before going to the Dixie Stampede dinner attraction. Dolly

Parton owns this production and she sure didn't leave anything out creating it. It is a <u>real family show</u> plus a delicious meal! We sat around the oval shape arena behind a counter for our table. This arena sits 1100 people. The food that was served was creamed soup, a WHOLE cornish hen, a slice of ham, half ear of corn (not Suter's), slice of a basted potato, biscuit and an apple fried pie along with drinks (coffee-tea-Pepsi). NO flatware, just your FINGERS!! If not full, it was your fault. During all this time of eating, the entertainment with horses, people, and skits were going on. The show was "outstanding," colorful, singing, and even had people from the crowd enter in on some contests. Horses were just beautiful and knew exactly what to do plus their riders were great riders and could perform tricks while on the horse. This was done early in the evening, so we had FREE time and people either visited with each other, played cards, went swimming, or just relaxed watching TV.

Wednesday was another beautiful morning with a full day planned. With the sun shining and temperature warm, it was perfect for walking around at Branson's Landing in Old Branson. About five of the group wanted to see the War Museum. A group went to Grand Country Music Hall. The rest of us went to the landing where we got on the trolley car that took you back to the Old Branson to shop. Others walked the landing area and watched the dancing waters at noon. On the way up the hill in the trolley, Keith spotted several antique/flea market shops and I knew where we were spending our time. Ha! First, I got him to go through Dick's Old Time 5 & 10, one of the seven wonders of Branson. It was so full of people, isles wide enough for one person, most of the time, items hanging from the ceiling, walls, and rest on shelves. Sometimes you had to watch at the end of the counters for things sitting there. We walked through FAST, purchased a couple of items to say we got them there, and off to the antique/flea market shops. One block had them on both sides and Keith was in "his highth of glory." Keith found a few things and I even found an item I wanted for sometime. We forgot about lunch but was time to meet the bus and we walked back to the landing where we started. Stopped back at the Inn for a little rest or change clothes for the Showboat Branson Belle dinner cruise. Arrived about 20 minutes before serving time and was seated right away to watch the pre-show entertainment. The meal was served and the boat started to move. Food was tasty and just the right amount, for once. A band played and the M.C. did some magic tricks while we were eating. When done with the meal, we were able to go out on the deck and enjoy the refresh air and enjoy the warm weather. About 20 minutes later, we were called back in to watch the main show. Five young men, some were waiters, sang songs from the 50's, acappella and was joined by a young lady, Janice Martin, who played the piano, violin, sang, and climbed a hanging sheet (like a long rope) doing tricks with it and played her violin while wrapped up in the sheet. One word, OUTSTANDING, for the whole group. Back to the bus and now on to the Jim Stafford show. He has been voted #1 entertainer for 22 years and would sing, tell stories, and play several string instruments. To me, he sounded like Garrison Keeler from Wisconsin on Public Radio on Saturday mornings. Was a relaxful and funny program, I felt. His 19 year old son and 13 year old daughter played the piano and both so talented. What a future for both of these young people.

Thursday, up at 7 a.m. for breakfast to get an early start for our last FULL day in Branson. First show was at the American Bandstand Theater to hear the Brett Family. As was all of the other shows, 2 hours, and the whole family involved. Instead of the five members, they were down to three. You could tell the show just wasn't the best with only three, and the son with them tried to be funny, do whatever extra that was needed. (Almost a one man show.) This was my least favorite, but they tried. This theater was hit by the tornado and had the roof taken off and everything ruined inside. Just 51 days ago, was when they started to repair roof, inside the theater, and restaurant next door. Total repair was around \$2 million dollars, they told us. Wow! This afternoon had another open time for about 4 hours and Bob let people pick out things they would like to do. Groups went to Joseph, coat of many colors, Joey Riley at Music City Theater, (Joey's new theater was totally destroyed by the tornado and hadn't even got to use it, so he performs in someone's else's.) Shanghai's Circus, China, go shopping at a mall, and others stayed at the Inn. At 5:30 p.m. we all met at Golden Corral for dinner and entertained by Barbara Fairchild & husband, Roy Morris. During her singing, she walked out into the crowd and sat on Carl Hermiller's lap and sang to him. Then some way, Carl and his wife, Bertie, ended up on stage dancing. This was the second time that Carl helped the entertainer's with their shows. Go Carl!!! The last show at Branson for us was Baldknobbers. For me it was what I was really looking for while at Branson: guitars, fiddles, steel guitar, classical guitar, banjo, drums, and piano playing country type songs. The **Baldknobbers** are **Branson's** 1st Country Show started in 1959 in the original 3-3 town. Some of the people performing are second and third generation from the original people. The band members and some performers wore western outfits with sparkles on shirts, dresses, pointed boots, and cowboy hats, of course! When a song was sung, you could understand the words and usually knew the tune. Two men dressed up like "hillbillys" and would come out between songs and carry on a dialogue with the M.C. regarding their everyday problems. Laugh and laugh so hard that one could cry alittle! Back on the bus and made a stop at Wal-Mart for bottled water for the trip to Ohio. Some were talking that they couldn't believe how we attended four shows today and survived. Wow!! But then again, this is why we came to Branson, to see shows!

Friday morning came early having our luggage outside the door by 7:30 a.m. and needed to be on the bus by 8 a.m. As we were leaving, the bus was quiet with everyone looking out the windows for the last look of town. It was alittle sad for me, wondering if I would return sometime and get to see a few more shows that looked good. But pictures and memories will help me to relive the week spent here and all the people we met. Keith and I met different people at shows and breakfasts from Virginia, Iowa, Montana, Kansas, and even Branson. For us, this is always interesting to hear about their area and we share ours. Arrived in St. Louis for a late lunch and on to Grant's Farm. Spent about 1 ½ hours looking over the animals there, checked out the carriage museum, and see the famous Clydesdales. Arrived at the Holiday Inn where we stayed again and we all were on our own for supper. People were happy to rest and get ready for an eight hour ride on Saturday to Ohio.

Bus was leaving at 8 a.m. after we ate breakfast. Had several stops and continued on and arrived at Bluffton at 6 p.m. A big THANK YOU to Bob & Bev for being good host & hostess along the way and serving the delicious cookies. Bev and I sort of figured that she made about 204 cookies total. YUM! Looking forward to a Virginia Christmas at the beach in November!

#### **Buyer Be Wise**

Recently, the BBB has been dealing with dozens of reports of a "phishing" scam being perpetrated through email accounts.

It works like this: The email account holder gets an email that appears to be a receipt for something purchased in the recent past. It may appear to be from a utility company, phone company, wireless phone company, or just a well-known national company that you may or may not have had some business dealings. It seems harmless enough, as it does not ask for money, but makes a point of explaining it is just a "notice of payment" and all you have to do is click on the link to confirm that you have received the "receipt." If you do that, it opens your computer to these crooks who can then dig into your database and mine your personal, sensitive, financial, and other information. It also installs a virus which damages your computer.

One of the more recent versions appears to have come from the U.S. Postal service. The letterheads and logos, even addresses on the bogus "receipts," look genuine and can fool even the closest inspection.

Rest assured, the above mentioned legitimate organizations do not send emails requesting you verify a receipt.

Of course, the acid test is to ask yourself, did I make such a purchase or make payment of such a bill?

As an example, this office recently received such a bogus email wanting us to confirm payment for our cell phone bill. It was \$1500. We never generate such a large bill and I immediately caught on to that one.

If you have clicked on a bogus link connected with this scam, notify your computer tech person immediately and have them check your computer.

This is a dangerous scam that could lead to loss of your computer, identity and money.




