From the principal:

With a quarter of the school year completed, I would like to thank our staff, students, and parents for a great start to the year. This fall our high school was rated "Excellent" by the Ohio Department of Education marking the 10th consecutive year we have received this distinction. This is a reflection of the hard work and strong values our students, staff, parents, and community possess.

Our students continue to excel in the classroom while being involved in a variety of extra-curricular activities. Over 70% of our student body participated in extra-curricular activities during the fall. Of our 105 varsity letter winners, the NWC awarded 95 of them as Scholar-Athletes, an honor given to those who received a varsity letter while maintaining a grade point average of 3.0 or higher.

Our staff has begun a professional development process called FIP, Formative Instructional Practices, to prepare for the changing standards and expectations from the ODE. The staff is involved in multiple after-school meetings, half-day trainings, and three 2-hr delay training days. Those three 2-hr delay days will be December 5, January 23, and April 3.

Parent-Teacher Conferences will be Monday, November 19 and Tuesday, November 20 from 5:00 pm – 8:00 pm in the high school. Call the office to schedule an appointment with your son/daughter's teachers. During these conferences, three 30 minute informational sessions will be offered for parents and students: Getting to Know ProgressBook, Test Preparation: ACT, SAT, OGT, & ACT Writing. No need to schedule an appointment for these sessions. A list of times and places are below.

I am always amazed at the support our students receive from their parents and our community in attending extra-curricular events, musical concerts, community service activities, monitoring grades through Progressbook, nightly homework checks, tutoring sessions, and many others. The interest that you show in your sons/daughters has a great impact on their success. 
