Triplett softball team in the 1944 season racked up the best record of any outfit in the district by winning 16 of 17 games against strong opposition.

The lone setback came at the hands of the Routh Packers, of Tiffin, a team which Triplett beat on the home field, 7 to 4, but which turned the tables at Tiffin for a 4 to 2 victory.

That the loss to Tiffin was no blot on the record of the outfit is seen in the fact that the Routh outfit was one of the few to defeat Ferguson's State Auditors during the regular season. The Auditor's outfit, with Dizzy Kirkendall, former Triplett hurler, on the mound, won the Ohio State championship in August.

During the regular season the Triplett crew scored dual victories over Ada O-K, Pandora, Columbus Grove, Cairo, Findlay Point Service and Findlay First Lutheran.

A two-game series was split with Tiffin Routh Packers, and single wins were racked up over Jenera, Findlay All-Stars and the Bluffton Lions team. The latter was an exhibition game played for the benefit of Buckeye Lake.

Timer Spaeth and Maynard Geiger were the hurlers for the crew thruout the season, and between them turned in four shuouts; four games in which opponents made but one run, and four in which only two runs were scored. In the 17-game schedule the Triplett team scored 147 runs against a total of 39 for the opposition.
