For almost twenty years she was involved with the Antioch Writers' Workshop and is now assistant professor of English at Bluffton University, specializing in fiction writing. For her writing she has received an Ohio Arts Council Fellowship, a Pushcart Prize nomination, and two first-place Westheimer awards from the University of Cincinnati. She has published essays, poetry, and short stories. This is her first novel.
