



TECUMSEH TRIP!

A wonderful day trip was planned for our group by Tonya. The State House in Columbus was an architectural and history lesson for all of us while we tried to remember if we had once learned the information in Jr. High or High School many years ago. Ohio, the 17th U.S. State, founded in 1803, placed the State House in several other cities until now were the present State House of today downtown Columbus. Building begun in 1839 and finally finished in 1861. The Greek revival structure was finished with Italian marble and beautiful carved wood. We observed additions that were made at several different times in its history. We had a review of what we probably once learned about Ohio government i.e. senate, representative, and court systems but sadly few could name the present representative and senator who represent us. After some FREE time to check out artifacts, and a quick stop in the gift shop, we hurried to our bus so we could hit the afternoon rush hour out of Columbus. Ha!

South we went to our next stop, Chillicothe to enjoy our outdoor adventure in the hills of southern Ohio. Our guided tour of the scenes behind the stage area and etc. had down on the stage to learn how special effects are created, what to watch for in the play (like falls from cliffs), visiting the horses with explanations of how they are maintained and trained as well as learning about costume changes and prop arrangements. 
